- Spring Street Highway Garage

Councilor Gallagher would like to see some exploration of the use of the Spring Street Garage. He knows there is a Downtown Revitalization Plan. Would like to see the Town River Landing developed. Councilor Gallagher outlined a few ideas he has for development, then asked Councilor Wood's opinion as it is in his district. Councilor Wood feels Spring Street is a unique. Thinks there should be a comprehensive look at the spot and the whole street for development and potential business growth. Councilor Colombotos stated he agrees with some of Councilor Wood's points. There is a lot of parking available. He pointed out that there's a need to also have the housing component within the mixed-use area and thinks an ad hoc committee would also be a good idea. Councilor Gallagher stated the downtown revitalization report picks out that area as one of the most important areas. The first thing we need to do is decide if we want to keep the property. Councilor Losche confirmed Mr. Gallagher wanted to take the building down and make it parking. Councilor Gallagher responded; a combination of parking and access to the park.

President Haley invited any questions from the public – None came forward.
President Haley asked if there was anyone speaking in favor – None came forward.

- **PUBLIC HEARING - 7:45 p.m.:** Petition P-2018-011: The Granting of a Class II Used Auto Dealers License - SKS Automotive Corp.
President Haley opened the hearing at 7:59 p.m.



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Attorney Rob Pellegrini came forward and explained the property is being utilized in the same manner. They are proposing a maximum of 30 vehicles. The parking stalls are lined but they are not planning to line the spots for vehicles.

President Haley invited any questions from the public – None came forward.

President Haley asked if there was anyone speaking in favor - None came forward.

President Haley asked if there was anyone speaking in opposition – None came forward.

President Haley entertained any questions from councilors:

- Councilor George referenced the comment from the Building Inspector asking for striping. Attorney Pellegrini responded; the parking stalls located and numbered on the site plan can be striped. Councilor George stated he would like to see that happen.
- Councilor Fitzgibbons pointed out the application is for 30 vehicles on display. We want to be sure there are 30 or fewer vehicles on display.
- Councilor Colombotos wondered what other site control there is regarding striping. Mr. Dutton responded there is not site plan approval required. Councilor Colombotos asked if we can make this approval contingent upon the Building Inspector's satisfaction.
- Councilor Wood stated he is unaware of any other car dealer that's required to stripe. If you require the striping, you limit how they can configure the yard.
- President Haley believes there needs to be the clear delineation between cars for sale, repair and parking.
- Councilor George reiterated he does not feel this is an unrealistic ask to define the space.
- Attorney Pellegrini explained there really isn't much room for extra stock, though he understands their point.
- Councilor Colombotos asked the Town Manager what other mechanisms there may be for compliance? Mr. Dutton responded; maybe if the applicant designates sales spots versus employee parking.

President Haley closed the hearing at 8:12 p.m.

TOWN MANAGER’S REPORT

Mr. Dutton reported on information about various activities happening around town and highlighted meetings and events. Items of note included: They have just about finished the Cherry Street paving project. There has been a request to make the Cherry Street/Short Street intersection a three way stop, which Mr. Dutton will look in to. The Mr. Dutton provided an update on their request to look into the downtown traffic; stating, he has reached out to Mass DoT to see what may be helpful in terms of pedestrian and vehicle traffic. Left turn signals could be a solution; however, that may cause additional backups. Mr. Dutton provided an update on Councilor George’s request to look into the high volume of Walnut Street outages. Mr. Dutton has contacted National Grid. A high number of the outages are due to tree issues; they’re currently looking into remedies. Once the data is available Mr. Dutton will have the National Grid rep in to speak to Council. Invoice Cloud has exceeded expectations. We are looking at revenues which are coming in quite well. Ambulance Receipts are on target according to our five-year projections. The Golf Course and Transfer Station had a bit of a surge at end of fiscal year. The Golf Course nearly met their budget and may not need the \$60,000 transfer/loan. Mr. Dutton met with the Cable Advisory Committee on potential renewal of cable contract with comcast. The Next step is to define areas where they can do better. Mr. Dutton reminded people the contract does not impact channel selection or rate. Mr. Dutton clarified; It is not the case that another vendor cannot come into town while we have a contract with Comcast. There have been five responses to the Paid Parking RFP. They are being reviewed internally and will be making a selection over the next week or so. We have engaged Attorney Mark Bobrowski and Planning Consultant Judi Barrett to look at a comprehensive rezoning. The Finance Director and Mr. Dutton participated in a workshop with Mark Abraham to better understand the regions – they learned we can much more accurately predict what state aid will be based on chapter 70 numbers. They have developed a project scope and timeline for LED streetlights which will dramatically reduce the amount of energy used. We are looking at December 2019 as a possible completion date. Mr. Dutton reminded all that the town is still seeking volunteers for Conservation Commission, Board of Health, Finance Committee, Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr. Dutton spoke about the Bridgewater Citizens Academy stating; he would like to propose we do something similar which incorporates all the different areas in town. Mr. Dutton is thinking the group would meet for roughly 10 weeks. He asked the Councilors to reach out to him directly if they feel there would be interest.



Councilor Questions:

- At Councilor Losche's request, Mr. Dutton confirmed he spoke with National Grid about District 1. Councilor Losche noted her support of an Academy.
- Councilor George thanked Mr. Dutton for getting National Grid to respond and asked that we continue to push this along.
- Councilor Gallagher asked if any consideration put into the streetlights that are not on town property in terms of the LED streetlight project. Mr. Dutton responded; we'll look at the lights that were "red capped" and those that were taken over by home owners. That will be part of the assessment process.
- Councilor Sousa thanked the Town Manager for having the stump he referenced at the last meeting taken out.
- Councilor Colombotos asked how much less the LED streetlights are. Mr. Dutton responded he has heard less than half. Mr. Colombotos agrees with Mr. Gallagher to look at turning on some of the street lights which were shut off previously. He then expressed support for the volunteer academy program and volunteered to help. At Mr. Colombotos' request, Mr. Dutton clarified the streets included in the paid parking RFP as: School Street, the town lot behind Town Hall, and the Spring Street lot. Finally, Councilor Colombotos reminded the Town Manager that there was a bike path proposal in the Downtown Revitalization plan and suggested they consider that when looking at the paid parking.

SUBCOMMITTEE REPORTS:

- Budget & Finance Committee: Committee Chair Wood stated the committee met tonight. He noted; the openings on Finance Committee delay us. Mr. Wood loves the idea of Citizens Academy. Finally, Mr. Wood stated; the committee spoke about the Free Cash Policy and the last three items on this evening's agenda under Legislation for Action.
- Community & Economic Development Committee Chair Colombotos stated the committee met with the Community & Economic Development Director. She stressed to the committee the importance of stepping back to be sure where we want to go as a town.

Motion: A motion to approve was made by Councilor Fitzgibbons. The motion was seconded by Councilor Colombotos.
Discussion: Councilor Colombotos asked Mr. Dutton what a reasonable deadline date would be. Mr. Dutton responded; 11/1/18.
Motion: A motion was made by Councilor Colombotos to change "June 1st" to November 1st". The motion was seconded by Councilor Fitzgibbons.

Discussion (cont'd on main motion): Councilor Colombotos stated his feeling that infrastructure is really important, and we're challenged in town.
A roll call vote was taken with results recorded as follows:

- O-FY18-040 Amend/Replace Order O-2012-038 - Free Cash Policy
Councilor Wood explained he introduced this order as a way to edit the existing Free Cash Policy. However, there have been no proposals for changes, therefore he will withdraw the order.
- Order O-FY18-041: Transfer Order - Employee Sick Leave Buy-Back (SLBB) Liability Transfers
Motion: A motion to approve was made by Councilor Fitzgibbons. The motion was seconded by Councilor Sousa.
Discussion: Mr. Dutton briefly explained; some employees are eligible for sick leave buy back. This is a transfer of funds to fund sick leave buy back for a couple of fire employees and one police employee. Councilor Fitzgibbons asked if this transfer reflects the town having looked forward to set up the liability and this transfer.



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Mr. Dutton responded in the affirmative. Councilor Wood noted both Budget & Finance and Finance Committees approved this measure.

A roll call vote was taken with results recorded as follows:

- Order O-FY18-042: Transfer Order - General Fund Transfer of Other Non-Recurring Revenue to Capital

Motion: A motion to approve was made by Councilor Fitzgibbons. The motion was seconded by Councilor Gallagher.

Discussion: Mr. Dutton briefly explained; this order transfers funds received during the year and puts them into the Capital Stabilization Trust.

Motion: A motion was made by Councilor Wood to amend account numbers as presented. The motion was seconded by Councilor Fitzgibbons.

Discussion: None

A voice vote was taken, and the motion to amend passed 9-0.

Discussion (cont'd on main motion): Councilor George asked; at what point do we consider something recurring revenue, noting his belief that the town can get a little more aggressive about putting monies into general revenue. Mr. Dutton responded; if it's something that appears on the Cherry Sheet. At Councilor George's request, Mr. Dutton confirmed Prison Mitigation funds would never be considered recurring revenue as they are open to 9C cuts. Councilor Gallagher agreed with Councilor George. Councilor Fitzgibbons echoes previous comments to some extent but suggested only earmark a percentage based on historical data.

Discussion: Mr. Dutton explained; we've had Verizon approach us to ask if it's feasible to mount equipment on the High Street water tower. When we go out to bid anyone can bid on it. It is non-exclusive, so we could accommodate more than one company.

Discussion followed relative to the \$650K earmarked for stabilization, with Councilor George noting his feeling that going forward would be helpful to see some of the funds go elsewhere. Councilor Fitzgibbons pointed out stabilization is one source where we can put funds for



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future use. Councilor Wood suggested; perhaps there needs to be discussion around when to tap into Stabilization in a downturn.

Discussion: Councilor Fitzgibbons thanked BSU for another generous donation to the town. A voice vote was taken and the motion passed 9-0.

- Order O-FY19-012: Acquiring Property on Summer Street – Mobile Station

**9:26 p.m. Councilor Colombotos recused himself as a neighbor to the property and exited the meeting.*

Motion: A motion was made by Councilor Fitzgibbons to refer to the Community & Economic Development Committee. The motion was seconded by Councilor Losche.

Discussion: Councilor Gallagher pointed out; this is in the Downtown Revitalization Plan. He suggested; perhaps we can take a proactive approach to this. If we were to try to acquire through eminent domain, would get a fair price. Councilor Losche asked if this is similar to another order that was put forward? Councilor Gallagher responded; there needs to be a reason to take a building by eminent domain. Councilor Chase asked the status of the underground tanks is. Mr. Dutton responded; he believes they are removed. Later in the agenda there is a transfer request to begin the appraisal process. Councilor George pointed out his belief that the property behind is vacant/condemned.

A voice vote was taken and the motion passed 8-0-1 (Councilor Colombotos abstained)

In order to begin the process, you have to conduct a specialized appraisal of the property. Mr. Dutton pointed out; he wouldn't expend the funds until the Council votes to approve the eminent domain. Councilor George asked if it was a problem that there are no account number identified on the order. Mr. Dutton responded; "no". Mr. Wood asked if we can amend the street number.
Motion: A motion was made by Councilor Wood to amend by changing the street number to "46". The motion was seconded by Councilor Fitzgibbons.

A voice vote was taken and the motion passed 8-0-1 (Councilor Colombotos recused)
